### 8. <u>CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT</u>

#### (a) Education Links Report

Last meeting of the Education Links committee was held January 19, 2010. Highlights:

- Lori Druissi spoke on January 15 Pro D about differentiating instruction for middle years students
- Ray Appel spoke to teachers, students and parents January 25-27 about new math curriculum
- Request for workshop on OI regarding multi-age teaching
- Middle Years program what does this look like on Mayne, Pender, Galiano and Saturna if student doesn't attend SIMS?
- Enhancement Agreement discussion
- Full-day Kindergarten discussion
- Report card implementation and review

#### (b) Report Card Update

Mr. Hopkins has received more feedback from parents, the Principal Vice Principal group and students regarding the new report card template. When all input has been received the committee will review the template again and revise if necessary. It is not available for use at the high school at this point. GISS is using the BCeSIS report card template at present and staff would like to hold off on changing it again too soon. Other districts have shown interest in using the template. ### (c) Coaching Initiative

The district piloted an initiative for coaching staff in leadership positions and contracted two people in the community who are trained to coach. It has been well received and has had a major impact on staff members in leadership positions. The coaches would like to make a presentation to the Board, after which the program will be formally evaluated and a report will be submitted to the Board.

#### (d) Camosun Partnership

School District #64 is in partnership with Camosun, particularly in trades. School District 64 would like Camosun's affiliation to expand with the district by offering courses (university level) to students and community members who don't want to do all courses online. Camosun staff will look at the "how, when and where" of offering courses and what those courses may be.

## (e) All Day Kindergarten Update

Mr. Hopkins informed Board members that every district in the province is doing something slightly different with regards to implementing full-day Kindergarten in September 2010. Three districts are opting out for the next school year and will implement the program in September 2011 when it is fully funded. For School District 64 the focus will be on structure of the classroom and support for the teacher.

#### (f) Field Trip Request

A field trip request (#94) from Ghislaine St. Venant, GISS teacher, to take ten Grade 11 French Immersion students to Ottawa, Ontario April 4 – 10, 2010, to participate in Encounters Canada Youth Forum on Vimy: The Coming of Age of Canada. All the students are from the intensive French Immersion curriculum.

It was moved and seconded that the Board of Education approves the extra-curricular field trip for ten Grade 11 French Immersion students to travel to Ottawa, Ontario from April 4 - 10, 2010 to participate in Encounters Canada Youth Forum on Vimy: The Coming of Age of Canada.
