7. <u>CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT</u>

(a) Planning Day/Retirees Luncheon

Marie Mullen and Stella Weinert showed *"Waterdrops – Guardians of Ganges Creek"*, a PowerPoint presentation that involved SSE students in a Grade 4/5 class. The students "achieved fostering water stewardship by studying and mapping Ganges Creek watershed, rehabilitating the creek, monitoring the creek quality, releasing salmon into the creek, playing by the creek and writing haikus".

The planning sessions went well and the retirement luncheon was enjoyed by all. Ms McKenzie announced in the May 7, 2010 edition of the "Report on Education", Deputy Minister, James Gorman spoke to the "Ministry's ongoing shift towards 21st Learning" and John Abbott's visit to speak to the Ministry on March 24 and 25. Mr. Gorman also states, "SD64 has put many of John Abbott's principles into action and certainly challenged our thinking within the Ministry". On May 5, former student James Thiebault and Grade 12 student, Abbie Sherwood attended a Ministry meeting with Superintendent Hopkins and "engaged in a thought provoking dialogue" with the Deputy Minister and other Ministry members.

8. <u>CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT</u>

(a) Education Links Report

Last meeting of the Education Links committee was held April 20, 2010. Highlights:

- Pro D has extended to parents as well as staff math manipulatives, English "How do I Mark That" by Ray Appell; how to use internet in research; internet plagerism; mentorship programs
- Middle years differentiation of instruction
- Early Learning Strong Start facilitators attended second provincial workshop case studies, issues related to helping parents. Science World activities for pre-schoolers

• Island Net – full day kindergarten workshop. What do we need in each space? Very different in each school. Teachers will continue to attend workshops. Book by Stuart Brown "Play: How it Shapes the Brain, Opens the Imagination, and Invigorates the Soul"

(b) District Retreat and Planning Day Follow Up

All summarized material from the district retreat was sent to all partner groups, which facilitated each school's planning process on District Planning Day. Staff members from each school were able to focus more on specific goals they felt were part of their vision for their school by using the district retreat material.

(c) Update on Connecting Generations

The Connecting Generations pilot project the *Living Library*, is a library of community/school resource people who are listed in a database and can be "borrowed" in order to obtain information on their particular area of expertise. There are 43 people in the database so far and details are being worked out to get it online. Sarah Hook-Nilsson is the coordinator of the project and if anyone requires information or would like to be part of the project, contact Ms Hook-Nilsson at GISS.

(d) Tech Planning

Mr. Hopkins has worked with the Principal/Vice Principal group and a technology consultant to identify the process of elevating the level and use of district technology and how to integrate it into subjects in our district schools.

(a) Monthly Expenditure Report

The monthly expenditure report indicates that with 83.33% of the year completed, 80.08% of the budget has been expended. We are 3.25% below budget at this time. There should be a small surplus at end of this school year.

(b) 2010/2011 Five Year Capital Plan Summary

Secretary Treasurer Rod Scotvold presented the Five Year Capital Plan Summary for the 2010/11 school year. The plan includes three bus replacements.
