Fernwood Elementary School

> Galiano Community School

PAC meeting yesterday, they gave \$1500 to the school to be divided between the primary and intermediate classes – intermediate class will go to Camp Thunderbird, primary class will go to the Children's Festival in Vancouver and museum in Victoria; Feb. 23 – information and workshop around bullying (pink shirt day) with hot lunch, open to community members, what bullying looks like from both sides; bee- keeping program, but didn't get the funding for 3 hives; principal asked

the PAC if they could help and they will fund one hive, need 2 hives so will fundraise with a spell off; main bus driver is off on medical leave, hiring sub/casual; day care on Galiano, will do survey to deetermine what the needs on Galiano are for all age groups, have 35 pre-schoolers

Final exams right now; GISS Improv performed with SIMS Improv group and an Improv group from Saanich at ArtSpring

7. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

(a) Board Committees

Trustee Rob Pingle has assumed the Chair of the Policy Committee and Superintendent Jeff Hopkins has been added as a resource person for this committee. The Capital Regional District has been added as a community group with Trustee Pete Williams as the representative.

(b) BCPSEA AGM

The BCPSEA AGM will be held January 27-29, 2011 at the Coast Coal Harbour Hotel. Chair McKenzie, Mr. Hopkins and Mr. Scotvold are attending. Trustee Pete Williams is running for Director again.

(c) School Community Connections

Subsequent to applications submitted to the 2010 School Community Connections – Supporting Neighbourhood Learning Centres (Round 2), the district has received \$17,000 which will be used to complete the SEEC residential cabins and the central outdoor classroom and \$13,000 plus another \$2,000 for upgrades to the multi-purpose sport court at Pender Islands School. Chair McKenzie extended a thank you to Mr. Hopkins for all his work and time spent preparing grant proposals for the district.

8. CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

(a) Superintendent's Report on Student Success

Mr. Hopkins sent his report to trustees electronically in December for their perusal and input. The report was accepted by the Board of Education on January 13, 2011 and submitted to the Ministry by the January 15 deadline. The document focused on six elements, as required by Ministry policy:

- 1. Improving areas of student achievement
- 2. Challenging areas of student achievement
- 3. Comments on Ministry-provided results
- 4. Progress toward goals set in achievement contract
- 5. Connectedness of plans
- 6. Children in care

This year's report also contains information from Victor Glickman regarding district Grade 10 and 12 exam results and FSA 2010 results. Victor Glickman is the founding director of *Edudata* Canada (http://edudata.educ.ubc.ca/site/home/), and a research associate at the UBC Faculty of Education.

Once again this year the district exam results have included International students and the graduation rate is shown as one of the lowest in the province. The inclusion of the International students skews the report as the students leave usually after one year and do not graduate with our district students. They are therefore shown as dropouts. Mr. Hopkins calculated the graduation rate and determined it is around 93%, which is one of the highest graduation rates in the province. He also noted that upon return to their respective countries, the International students completed their courses and graduated. Mr. Hopkins contacted the Ministry again regarding the method of calculating grad rates and will follow up with a press release to indicate the correct graduation rate with an explanation of how they are calculated by the Ministry.

The report will be uploaded to the district website for public viewing.

(b) District Retreat

The Annual District Retreat, entitled, "Personalized Learning in the Gulf Islands – From Vision to Action", will be held Tuesday, March 1, 2011 in the gym at Saltspring Island Middle School. The theme will be to continue with personalized learning discussions and what it will look like for our district; narrow the focus now and look at details.

(c) Field Trip #50

An extra-curricular field trip request (#50) from GISS teacher Ray Colleran to take 18 Grade 10-12 students to Italy and France March 10-19, 2011 to participate in cultural experiences in Rome and Paris.

It was moved and seconded that the Board of Education approves extra-curricular field trip #50 for 18 Grade 10-12 students to travel to Italy and France March 10-19, 2011 to participate in cultural experiences in Rome and Paris.
