7. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

(a) Board Committee Structure

Lisa Halstead's name has been added as a resource to the Programs, Personnel and Policy Board Standing Committees. There are no further changes at this time.

(b) Amend date of Notice of Motion to March 13, 2013

A request was put forth to change the date from February 13, 2013 to March 13, 2013 in the Notice of Motion regarding the local school calendar presented at the December 5, 2012 Board meeting.

It was moved and seconded that the Board of Education change the Notice of Motion to read as follows:

It was moved that the Board of Education adopts a Local School Calendar for the 2013/2014 school year that reduces the number of instructional days by approximately 25 to 30 resulting in a four-day school week. The instructional time from these days will be added to the remaining days of instruction. The resulting savings will allow the district to preserve programs and options for our students. The motion will be tabled at the regular Public Board meeting on **March 13, 2013**.

(c) Climate Justice Project

In September 2012 the Board sent a letter of support for funding to the Vancouver Foundation on behalf of the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives (CCPA-BC), which resulted in CCPA-BC receiving a grant for the project. The next step is to develop resources through this project that will

help facilitate discussions about climate change in classrooms and communities. Trustee Byers will attend upcoming meetings on behalf of the Board.

8. CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

(a) Field Trip Request #46

An extended field trip request (#46) from GISS teachers Dean Crouse, Ray Colleran and Peggy Williams to take 16-18 Grade 9 to 12 students to Hungary, Austria, Czech Republic and Germany from March 14 to 28, 2013. This tour is in conjunction with EF Educational Tours. Superintendent Hopkins has approved this trip pending informed consent and itinerary.

It was moved and seconded that the Board of Education approves extended field trip #46 for 16-18 Grade 9 to 12 students to travel to Hungary, Austria, Czech Republic and Germany from March 14 to 28, 2013.

Trustee Pingle asked about liability during these field trips. Superintendent Hopkins responded that the district is liable. Itinerary details are important so parents / guardians have all the necessary information regarding the trip before they sign the informed consent forms.

(b) Superintendent's Report on Student Achievement

The Board accepted Mr. Hopkins' report on student achievement at the morning meeting. At that time, Mr. Hopkins presented his report explaining most of the information contained in the report is actually taken from the period before last year's Achievement Contract. The goals can be commented on; however there is no conclusive evidence of student achievement at this time of year only, "early measures that serve as starting points for individualized and group intervention".

(c) Jane Thornthwaite

Ms. Thornthwaite will visit the district on Committee Day, January 23. She was a School Trustee for the North Vancouver Board of Education in 2005 and 2008 and resigned from the Board June 2009 after being elected to the Legislature. She was appointed *Parliamentary Secretary for Student Support and Parent Engagement* to the Minister of Education in September 2012. Her role is to facilitate communication between parents and government.

(d) IT Audit

School District #64 (Gulf Islands), along with a number of other districts, will undergo an IT audit in February / early March this year. The auditors will be looking for how the district secures data, protects privacy, stores and shares data / information. The district has worked over the past five years to improve a number of issues and this audit will identify areas that require more attention. At present there is not much in the way of provincial regulation in education regarding technology.

(e) Island Leadership Coalition (ILC)

ILC is "a group of 11 Vancouver Island school districts and Vancouver Island University, working together to build a network, a 'community of practice' where educational leaders can share their expertise and knowledge". Participants are current principals and vice principals, aspiring school administrators and teacher leaders. There were no meetings last year because of the teachers' job action; however, the program will be rejuvenated this February. John Abbott will facilitate the first of six sessions, which will run between February 2013 and May 2014.

ERASE Bullying

Mr. Hopkins reported that to date there have been zero reports for our district on the new online student reporting tool. Long before the Ministry's implementation of this new system in November 2012 the district already had processes in place for students / staff to talk about bullying.
