# (a) Upcoming Events

Superintendent Halstead shared information on the upcoming events:

- Math Collaborative Inquiry Project four sessions are planned, the first session is January 23; 30 district teachers who teach math (or related field) to students in grade 4-12 are attending; focus will be on "improving mathematical thinking through developing thinking skills across the curriculum"
- District Retreat is on March 7

- As SD64 is hosting the PBS workshop we will receive a free workshop compliments of The Society for the Promotion of Social and Academic Success. The focus on Planning Day (May 9) is on collaboration and the key-note speaker for the morning session is available from the society to speak on the Power of Collaboration in the Support of Students
- April 4 is the DPAC parent retreat, which will focus on Aboriginal ways of learning

### 8. CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

#### (a) Learning in School District #64

Ms. Halstead and Mr. Livingston presented a paper titled, "Using Inquiry to Transform and Expand a School District Paradigm to Embrace a Commitment that All Children Learn" at the International Congress for School Effectiveness and Improvement (ICSEI,) 2014 Congress in Yogyakarta, Indonesia held January 2 to 7, 2014 (<a href="http://www.icsei.net/index.php?id=1618">http://www.icsei.net/index.php?id=1618</a>).
