7. CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

(a) Meeting with Ministry / BCSTA

The *I*st Annual Liaison Meeting of BCSTA and the Ministry of Education is scheduled for October 21, 2015 in Richmond. Board Chairs, Superintendents and Secretary Treasurers have been invited "to engage in dialogue and work through some key topics and challenges in an effort to strengthen and transform BC's K-12 education system". The implementation of the new curriculum, the new

framework for enhancing student learning, and financial accountability will be topics of focus. Superintendent Halstead and Chair McKenzie will attend.

8. CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

(a) Learning in School District No. 64 (Gulf Islands)

Ms. Halstead recently received a letter from the Innovation Partnership Working Group (IPWG) extending congratulations on two proposals regarding Communicating Student Learning that were submitted in June 2015 and have been accepted into the partnership as one project. School District No. 64 (Gulf Islands) is one of 17 school districts involved in the Innovation Partnership project. District schools involved include SSE, Fulford, Fernwood, SIMS, Galiano Phoenix Elementary and Learning Services and GISS. The project will receive \$8,000 in financial support for teacher release time, research, and project expenses, plus there will be opportunities for project teams to collaborate with colleagues and explore how these innovative concepts could be adopted by other school districts. A K-12 Innovation Partnership provincial session is scheduled for October 20, 2015. Attending this session along with Ms. Halstead are Shelly Johnson, Principal of SSE, Janet Hoag, K-5 Curriculum Coordinator/Inquiry Teacher Leader, and Rachel FitzZaland, GISS teacher.

(b) Staffing / Enrollment Update

Superintendent Halstead stated 1701 verifications are due to the Ministry on October 16, 2015. The number of regular students enrolled is 1733, which is an increase of 103 over the projection of 1630. An increase in enrollment can partially be attributed to the new nature programs introduced at Fernwood and Fulford Elementary Schools – Kindergarten is up 21 students and grades 1 to 3 has an increase of 44. At Windsor House School grades 1 to 3 has an increase of 25 students and a total of 202 students this year. Extra staffing has been added to accommodate the increase in student numbers.

(a) 2015/16 Capital Plan Submission

Mr. Scotvold presented *CP2 – Five Year Capital Plan Summary* for the procurement of two 71-passenger buses for School District No. 64 (Gulf Islands), which specifies a maximum expenditure of \$232,260.00.

It was moved and seconded that the Board of Education approves the 2015 Five Year Capital Plan submission as presented.
