POLICY 203 Property Control

"Inspire learners, Integrate sustainability, Involve community"

Rationale:

The School District No. 64 Board of Education recognises that, in order to promote and sustain safe, orderly and productive learning and working environments, it is necessary to exercise control over district properties.

Policy:

In accordance with provisions in the School Act, the Motor vehicle Act and CRD Bylaw No. 3533 the board establishes policy and procedure governing:

- 1. how, when and under what circumstances motorized and human-powered vehicles can enter onto, and be used upon district property
- 2. how, when and under what circumstances people, including staff, students, parent/guardians, visitors and others having business with the school district, may enter onto district property
- 3. under what circumstances persons shall be directed to leave district property; and
- 4. under what circumstances persons in section 3 above shall be permitted to return to district property

The board authorises school principals to exercise control over their respective school properties, consistent with this policy.
