PROCEDURE 215 Diversity

"Inspire learners, Integrate sustainability, Involve community"

Section: Learning and Working Environment Dates of Revisions: Date of Adoption and Resolution Number: June 13, 2018- 76/18

Definition: 'LGTTIQQ' is an acronym developed by, and referring collectively to, individuals and groups self-identifying as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, two-spirited, intersex, questioning, and queer.

- **1.** The School District No. 64 Board of Education will promote district-wide efforts to ensure diversity is respected and supported by
 - a. requiring that school codes of conduct and discipline procedures and practices include provisions supporting this;
 - b. requiring that school discipline procedures address situations in which diversity is neither respected nor reported in ways that are both educationally-focused and developmentally appropriate;
 - c. providing appropriate in-service training opportunities that both help promote respect of and support for diversity, to teachers, support staff, parents and other members of school communities;
 - d. working with the community to prevent discrimination of any sort, including discrimination on the basis of race, ethnicity, gender identity, gender expression, or sexual orientation.
- 2. The board will work closely with both the LGTTIQQ community and the GISS Gay/Straight Alliance (acting in an advisory capacity) to do the following:
 - a. review, implementation and further develop strategies to promote awareness and respect, and safe, caring and inclusive school environments;
 - b. provide opportunities for school communities to increase awareness of the scope and impact of discrimination against the LGBTTIQQ community and to create an inclusive environment;

- c. support educational programs through the provision of age-appropriate resources and activities;
- d. in the regular course of reviewing policy, procedure, and other district documents, ensure that the language and imagery used is representative of the diversity in our community;
- e. ensure that when schools are reporting on their effort to promote a violence-free district and support for diversity, they speak to matters of multi-culturalism, gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation.
- 3. The board will continue to support and take advice from advisory bodies, as a way of further promoting diversity and equity.
