- ▶ Ability to interpret assessment documentation related to visual impairments and determine appropriate levels of support
- ▶ Training and experience in the use of low vision aids, assistive technology, and accessible learning materials
- ▶ Ability to provide instruction in braille (as required) and visual efficiency/visual skills
- ▶ Proven ability to adapt instructional materials and integrate technology to support an effective learning environment
- ▶ Proven ability to provide consultation and support to classroom teachers regarding inclusive practices, curriculum adaptation, and instructional strategies
- ▶ Experience working with Provincial Resource Centre for the Visually Impaired (PRCVI) and other outside agencies
- ▶ Experience working in inclusive environments supporting learning for all students
- ▶ Valid B.C. Class 5 Driver's License

- ▶ Experience working in an itinerant role supporting students across multiple school sites
- ▶ Strong organizational and case management skills, including maintaining student documentation and reporting requirements

- ▶ High energy, enthusiasm, and ability to collaborate with colleagues as part of a multidisciplinary team
- ▶ Leadership skills necessary to develop, establish, and evaluate effective and proactive supports for students with diverse learning needs
