## Field Trips

Students in Melissa Hingston class and Brian Reid's class went to Cusheon Cove to study forest ecosystems. This was organized by the Salt Spring Conservancy. Learning centers included whittling, First Nations use of Stinging nettle for fibers and rope, learning about the Chinese, Japanese, and European presence at Bullman Sawmill in the early 1900s with an artifact museum, and a compass treasure hunt to learn about history.

Students in Malindi Curtis', Myriah Michaux, Cathryn Pyper, Heidi Cameron and Al MacLean's classes got to go to the Bond Farm to the Pumpkin Patch to take a pumpkin home!

## ADEQUATE CLOTHING FOR THE COLD RAINY WEATHER

As we move further into the rainy and colder months, we've noticed that many students are arriving at school without adequate clothing for the weather. Students go outside for recesses and learning activities in all weather, except in the most extreme weather conditions. To ensure all children stay warm, dry, and comfortable throughout the day—especially during outdoor activities—it is essential that they come dressed appropriately.

**Please** make sure your child arrives in weather-appropriate attire, including a waterproof jacket, warm layers, and suitable footwear. We also ask that each student keep a spare set of clothes at school (including socks and pants) in case of unexpected weather-related changes.

If a student is not dressed suitably and does not have extra clothing available, we will need to contact home to request a clothing drop-off. We appreciate your support in helping us minimize these disruptions and keep all students safe and ready to learn.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Childhood immunizations play a very important role in reducing many preventable diseases in children. As part of the B.C. immunization program, starting at age 4, children are eligible to receive school entry boosters. Routine boosters include Tdap-IPV (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis/whooping cough and polio) and MMRV (measles, mumps, rubella & chickenpox). Some children may also be due for additional immunizations based on their individual immunization history.

If your child has not received their school entry boosters, or if you have questions about their immunization status, please call your local public health unit to schedule an immunization appointment or speak to a Public Health Nurse.

Health Gateway (<a href="https://www.healthgateway.gov.bc.ca/">https://www.healthgateway.gov.bc.ca/</a>) can be used to find out if your child's immunization records are in the Provincial Immunization Registry. If your child was immunized at a public health unit, community health centre, school, or pharmacy, their record should already be in the registry. If your child was immunized at a First Nations community health centre, doctor's office, or outside of BC, their record might not be in the registry.

If your child's immunization record is incomplete in Health Gateway and you have a paper record, you can submit the record online at <a href="https://www.immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca./">https://www.immunizationrecord.gov.bc.ca./</a> (records must be in English or French or a certified translation). Once the records are updated, you can access them through Health Gateway. If you have questions, please call your local public health unit for support.
