LEARNING THROUGH PLAY

Play is integral in children's learning, growing, and meaning making. In kindergarten, your child will engage in many play-based learning opportunities to support their holistic development (physical, emotional, social, linguistic, and intellectual).

STAGES OF PLAY

Play-based learning can be described along a continuum. The aim of this continuum is to highlight the different forms of play and the wonderful ways they can support a child's development.

Guided by the **BC Curriculum**, your child will engage in multiple ways of learning through curricular competencies and core competencies. A few of these areas are described on the following page. Primary teachers are also guided by the **Early Learning Framework**, which affirms that primary students learn best when:

- activities are play based, involving exploration and inquiry, with hands-on activities that engage all their senses
- activities are developmentally and culturally appropriate
- The adults in their world teachers, families, school, and community members - work together to support them

Literacy and Numeracy



Over the course of the year, your child will engage in activities to support their reading, writing and numeracy development.

These activities will target specific skills such as oral language, alphabet knowledge, concepts of print, and number sense.

Physical Literacy



Physical activity supports the development of fine motor (hands, fingers, toes), gross motor (arms, legs, core), fundamental

movement (balance, locomotion), and coordination (hand-eye, foot-eye) skills. Your child will engage in these skills throughout the day, and they are an essential part of Gym time and Recess.

Play-based Centres



Centres time is filled with rich opportunities to explore various stages of play. During centres time, children learn through role playing,

collaboration, social and emotional learning and skill development, experimenting, and inquiry. Centres time is often a highlight of a child's day!

Outdoor Learning



Outdoor environments connect children to a sense of place and foster children's connections to the natural world, the

physical and social communities they live in, and cultural learning on ancestral lands of local Indigenous peoples. Your child's school has a school garden, outdoor classroom, and outdoor play spaces to support this learning.

HELPFUL TIPS:



At school, your child will have their own cubby spot to store their belongings. In the morning, they will hang their backpack and coat at their cubby spot and change from outdoor shoes into indoor shoes. *Note: Velcro or slip-on shoes are great for quick changes!*

Each day your child will need the following in their backpack:

- a lunch and snack
- a water bottle
- a spare change of clothes (it may be helpful to leave additional clothing items at your child's cubby)

Practicing the morning routine a few weeks before school starts can be helpful for your child in adjusting to a new schedule.



Where possible, encourage your child to zip up their jacket, put on shoes, use the washroom, and close lunch containers independently.


